

2022 TERMINOLOGY SURVEY

MALE GENITAL MUTILATION AND CHILD ABUSE ARE PREFERRED TERMS


OVERVIEW

Intact America surveyed its supporter/donor mailing list concerning what legal terminology to use when describing the circumcising actors in the medical establishment (but not when speaking about parents).

A link to the survey was included in the Intact America November/December newsletter. 52 volunteered to take the survey. 92.7% of participants were male.

PRIMARY FINDINGS

Q: In your opinion, which terms do you find most persuasive when describing circumcision actors?



Q: Terminology preference by sex:

- Male Genital Mutilation, M (93%), F (100%).
- Child Abuse, M and F were equally in agreement (86%)
- Child Sexual Assault, M much more agreed (80%) than F (47%)
- Child Sexual Abuse, M much more agreed (74%) than F (57%)
- Child Molestation, M were slightly more in agreement than F
- Rape, M agreed (35%), but F said no (0%)

Q: Which terms should Intact America use regarding doctors and hospitals? (M and F (respectively)

- Male Genital Mutilation, 67%, 86%
- Child Abuse, 19%, 14%
- Molestation, 0%, 0%
- Child Sexual Assault, 9%, 0%
- Rape, 5%, 0%
- Child Sexual Abuse, 0%, 0%

SECONDARY FINDINGS

13.7% of the men were mistaken of whether they were circumcised or not.

Many of the men are restoring their foreskins: Yes 42%, No 54%, I don't know what that is 5%

48% preferred to remain anonymous.
