



FORESKIN APPRECIATION DAY SURVEY

FORESKIN KNOWLEDGE

Surveyed were 500 randomly selected Americans: 250 intact men, 125 cut men, and 125 women

EVERYONE

- Regarding the quality of foreskin education in medical schools, opinions were equally one-third for no, maybe, and yes.
- Half thought the media treated the foreskin unfairly.

INTACT MEN

- Intact men were much more likely to not know that penises were sometimes circumcised.

CUT MEN

- Cut men learned earlier that penises came in two ways than did intact men or women.

WOMEN

- Most women think that the intact penis is difficult to keep clean.
- 40% of women had never seen or touched a foreskin.

AGES

- 18–30-year-olds were twice as likely as the rest to not know that penises came cut or intact.

FORESKIN ATTITUDE

EVERYONE

- Two-thirds of all respondents were confused by or opposed to a Foreskin Appreciation Day, while one-third wanted to join in the fun, mostly in the younger portion (our target audience for this event).
- Only 9% had a negative thought when they heard “foreskin.”

INTACT MEN

- 57% were pleased with their penis.
- 60% were never rejected by women because they were intact.
- 36% said women wanted to play with it when they first saw it.

CUT MEN

- 65% were pleased with their penis.
- 33% were interested in experiencing or getting their foreskin back.

WOMEN

- 58% never rejected an intact man, and 62% never rejected a cut man.
- 25% were curious about the foreskin.
- 29% were revulsed by the foreskin.
- 19% of women had a negative thought and 37% considered it “excess skin.”

AGES

- 31–45-year-olds were more likely to be revulsed (EWW!) by the foreskin.
